

Greensboro AHEC



The Greensboro AHEC serves as the focus of education and training for more than 16,000 health professionals in an eight-county region (Alamance, Caswell, Chatham, Guilford, Montgomery, Orange, Randolph and Rockingham). It is affiliated with the North Carolina Area Health Education Centers Program of the School of Medicine, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. The Greensboro AHEC is located in the Education Wing of the Moses H. Cone Memorial Hospital (auditorium, classrooms, conference rooms, medical faculty offices, and library), and in a suite in the Northwood Building (AHEC administration and continuing education faculty offices), directly across from the main gates of the Moses Cone Hospital.

Rotations throughout the Greensboro AHEC region for students and residents in allied health, clinical psychology, dentistry, medicine, nursing and pharmacy provide clinical experiences in both hospital and community healthcare practice sites. Educational specialists in allied health, learning resources, library and information services, nursing, pharmacy, mental health and public health are available as well to provide consultation and technical assistance at the AHEC and in the practice setting.

A wide range of continuing education programs are available to area health professionals through the Greensboro AHEC. The Moses Cone/Greensboro AHEC Library, one of the largest hospital-based medical libraries in the Southeast, serves the region's health professionals both directly as well as through electronic linkages with the region's hospitals and medical teaching practices.

TRAVEL AND ACCOMMODATIONS

Travel: Students scheduled for rotations at the Greensboro AHEC's main campus, at Moses Cone Hospital in Greensboro, usually leave Chapel Hill the day the rotation begins. It will take about one hour and fifteen minutes, approximately 55 miles, to drive from Chapel Hill to Greensboro. Students in community-based courses with preceptors in the Greensboro AHEC region can obtain travel time and directions from the ORPCE as noted below. Reimbursement for travel will be in accordance with Statewide AHEC Program guidelines, which may be obtained from the AHEC Program Office in Chapel Hill.

Directions to Greensboro: From Chapel Hill, take NC 54 west to I-85, then I-85 south to Mt. Hope Church Road exit to US-70 west, which becomes Wendover Avenue in Greensboro. See the accompanying map for directions to the Moses Cone and Greensboro AHEC offices.

Housing: Students on rotation at the main AHEC campus in Greensboro will be housed, when there is availability, in apartments on campus, coordinated by the AHEC housing coordinator. Students on rotation to community practices in the AHEC region will be housed, when there is availability, in facilities coordinated through the Greensboro AHEC's Office of Regional Primary Care Education

The apartments are within 200 yards of Moses Cone Hospital. Parking is available at the apartments. Keys for the apartments may be obtained from the beige AHEC box at the switchboard located on the first floor, by the west elevators, at Moses Cone Hospital on the first day of the rotation. If a student plans to arrive on the Sunday before the scheduled rotation, please notify the Greensboro AHEC housing coordinator in advance so necessary arrangements can be made. Because of the shortage of living quarters at Moses Cone Hospital, we request that students not ask for AHEC housing if they intend to commute on a daily basis. Room assignments are scheduled in advance. Requests for specific roommates cannot be considered unless the coordinator is notified at least four weeks prior to the rotation.

Pets: **ABSOLUTELY NO PETS ALLOWED!**

Meals: The hospital cafeteria provides a 20% discount on meals for medical students wearing their nametags for identification by cashier.

Laundry: A coin laundry is available within the apartment complex for personal laundry.
