The mission of Bowles Fellowship is to develop leaders in service: individuals who are dedicated and skilled in addressing the health needs of individuals with problems of alcohol dependence and alcoholic disease, and whose example influences and inspires others.

The overall goals of the North Carolina Bowles Fellows Program are:

1. To support students in the health and human services professions in providing direct service that addresses the health needs of underserved individuals and communities in rural or urban areas of the United States with substance abuse issues;
2. To support students in the health and human service professions in activities that strengthen their commitment to, and skills in, public service.
3. To alter the culture of health professional schools in the direction of more meaningful cooperation with the surrounding local communities to improve recognition of involvement in alcohol problems and health.
4. To create and sustain a cohort of Bowles alumni (Fellows for Life) who continue in community service throughout their professional lives and who are available to consult with current Fellows.
