Applicant Requirements

- USMLE Steps 1-3
- U.S. Residency or equivalent (visa) paperwork
- Ability to obtain a permanent N.C. medical license

United States Graduates

- Graduation from school accredited by LCME or AOA
- 3 years of accredited graduate training

Foreign Graduates

- ECFMG certified
- 3 years of accredited graduate training

- 3 letters of reference
