CONFERENCE OBJECTIVES

KEY PRESENTERS

Beth Walker, M. Ed., C.E.D., LSLS Cert. AVT is a Cert. AVT and Teacher of the Deaf. She has been teaching and learning from children who are deaf and their parents for over 30 years. She has used a variety of approaches including Auditory-Verbal, Oral, Cued Speech, and Total Communication in work with infants to adults. She is currently a practicing Auditory-Verbal therapist and instructor for First YEARS, a distance education program for professionals who work with children who are deaf/HH, offered through The University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill.

Katherine Wilson, M. Ed., C.E.D., LSLS Cert. AVT is a SLP, teacher of the deaf and Cert. AVT with more than 30 years of experience as an educator and therapist in public school, private practice, home-based, and clinical settings. Kathryn is the director of FIRST YEARS-housed at UNC-Chapel Hill, a consultant with WE Listen International, and a trainer for the Global Foundation for Children with Hearing Loss in Vietnam.

Oliver Adunka, M.D., F.A.C.S., is Assistant Professor of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery at UNC-Chapel Hill. A native of Vienna, Austria, he earned his medical degree from University of Vienna Medical School and did his residency in Germany. After completing his subspecialty training in Neurotology at UNC, he remained practicing all aspects of Otolaryngology, Neurotology, and lateral skull base surgery with research on various aspects of cochlear implants.

Bill Hatch received his B.S. in Health and Physical Education, and his M.A. in Adapted Physical Education. He taught students with developmental disabilities and autism and established the Adapted Physical Education Program for Durham. He then attended NC Central's School of Law in the Evening Law Program.

His legal positions have included working with the Governor's Advocacy Council for Persons with Disabilities [GACPD] and private practice where he practiced general civil law. Five years ago he combined his education and legal interests and started working with the NC DPI, as a Civil Rights Coordinator & Special Populations Consultant.
