Dr. Reuland is originally from Cincinnati, OH and received his undergraduate degree in English from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. He completed his MD degree at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine and his internal medicine residency at Yale New Haven Hospital in CT. Following residency, he and his wife (who is a pediatrician) worked for 4 years as primary care physicians at a small hospital on the Navajo Indian reservation in rural Arizona. From 1998 to 2006 he was a clinician educator faculty member at UNC and was medical director of UNC's community-based primary care practice at Chapel Hill North. Between 2006-2008 he completed health services research training in UNC's NRSA Primary Care Research fellowship along with an MPH degree. Since 2008 he has spent much of his effort on projects related to improving communication and health for vulnerable patient populations (see Research Summary below). He lives in Carrboro, NC with his wife and three children. He enjoys spending time with his family, sports (esp. soccer), traveling, and gardening.

RESEARCH SUMMARY

Dr. Reuland's research interests are in the areas of improving primary health care for vulnerable populations. A major area of research focus has been on understanding and improving health communication for limited English proficient Hispanic/Latino patients. His current projects are in developing and testing interventions to promote colorectal cancer screening in diverse, patient populations served in safety net care settings. Other current research areas of interest include promoting informed and

shared medical decision making for lung cancer screening and improving clinical care and communication for patients who have limited health literacy.
