Article 7 Academic Assistance

7.01 Academic Assistance

- 1) The School of Medicine provides academic assistance to students who have remediable academic difficulties.
- 2) Academic assistance includes tutoring, academic skill development counseling, and monitoring progress.
- 3) All academic assistance is coordinated through the Office of Student Affairs.

7.02 Competency Driven Support Program

- 1) Any student who is underperforming in a clinical course in any competency will be advised as such by the course director, who will initiate an individualized Competency Driven Support Program for that student by submitting the appropriate request to Clinical Academic Resources.
- 2) Professionalism issues recognized outside of individual clerkships/ courses should prompt the Dean's office to submit a CDSP request to Clinical Academic Resources.
- 3) Students so identified will then meet with the Clinical Academic Resources Director to develop a remediation plan. The plan will be communicated with faculty as needed to facilitate the remediation and document subsequent attainment of competence.
- 4) The Director of Clinical Academic Resources and an ad hoc committee comprised of Student Affairs personnel and faculty will meet and review all CDSP remediation plans to coordinate implementation. Students are welcome to participate in this meeting and may be asked to do so.
- 5) Students who fail to comply with the remediation program or are still unable to demonstrate competence in the domain identified in the CDSP after completion of the remediation plan will be reviewed by the Student Promotions Committee.
