Horizons is a unique program of the UNC Department of OB/GYN and an affiliate of OPC-LME. PURPOSE

This conference will increase providers' understanding of the multiple issues involved in clinical practice with substance using women and their children.

TARGET AUDIENCE

Physicians, physician assistants, nurse, midwives, nurse practitioners, nurses, psychologists, social workers, substance abuse counselors, childcare providers, school personnel, parole and probation officers, students and others working with substance using women and their children.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

- Learn about attachment theory and addiction and its implications for treatment
- Learn how to address the shame of trauma and addiction issues within the patient's belief system
- Learn motivational interviewing techniques which can effectively engage women with trauma and substance abuse issues
- Learn about special issues such as short-and long-term neurobiological effects of drug exposure in utero, the impact of violence and substance abuse on families, and family treatment issues in the legal system
- Learn about the effectiveness of treatment from the perspectives of clients and providers
