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

## THE SYMPOSIUM

The Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and the Carolinas HealthCare System/Charlotte AHEC jointly present this symposium to provide practicing pathologists with a review of Update in Genitourinary Pathology.

The keynote speaker is Dr. John N. Eble, MD MBA FRCPA, from the Indiana University School of Medicine in Indianapolis, who will present the 14th annual Walter R. Benson Lecture on Clear Cell Papillary Renal Cell Carcinoma. Dr. Eble is an internationally recognized renal pathology and urologic pathologist. He is the Nordschow Professor of Laboratory Medicine and Professor and Chairman, Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine at Indiana University School of Medicine. Dr Eble is the Editor-in-Chief of *Modern Pathology*, and he served as Editor-in-Chief of the *Journal of Urologic Pathology*, the official journal of the International Society of Urologic Pathology, from 1997 to 2000. Dr. Eble has served three terms as Treasurer and was the President of the International Society of Urologic Pathology from 2003 to 2005.

All of the speakers will provide lectures designed to update the participants on important developments in diagnostic genitourinary pathology. Ample time will be provided for discussion and personal interaction between the faculty and attendees.
