I. Smartboard Update: Both Smartboards are installed in MBRB. Tristan Henderson (MSTL) has begun training individuals and groups in implementing this new resource into their courses. It was stressed that Mr. Henderson will work with anyone who is interested in learning about this technology from faculty to staff. Training will take about an hour depending on the depth of queries. II. 2004-05 Annual Report Draft Review: Working from a draft prepared by Alfred Reid, the committee reviewed the six major projects FACET was involved in for the 2004-05 year. Language and ideas were cleaned up and or fleshed out for the final draft which will be posted on line in the near future <http://www.med.unc.edu/curriculum/facet/>. Relevant topics not covered in the draft are:

- i. Dr. Reisner reported that the Virtual Microscopy (VM) server should be up and running by the time school begins in the fall and that some images might be kept off for testing purposes. Some departments will not use VM yet due to the lack of high powered magnification.
- ii. Reinforcement of the students' responsibility of bringing their own functional laptop for testing should be a priority in order to overcome the possible shortcoming of laptops in OED back up supply on test dates.
- iii. OED has successfully tested and is ready to implement privacy measures for testing.
- iv. Eve Juliano of OIS will present the Content Management Software in the next meeting. MS1 and MS2 will be live for the upcoming year.
- v. The Audience Response System still carries a large price tag. UNC only needs to purchase licenses for first and second year students. However, the "perpetual" license is a lifetime license only good for Student A and can not be transferred to Student B. In other words, licenses would need to be purchased every year rather than the University being able to transfer them from student to student. Mr. Reid will communicate with Eve Juliano and Sheila Storey to work on this overall cost.

III. Goals for 2005-06: The importance of FACET working together with the CC1 and CD2 Committees was stressed as new technologies are being investigated and implemented in the classrooms. Mr. Reid will work on bringing in Charlie Hitlin of OIS to present on all the new technology being incorporated into The School of Medicine Building and its possibilities.
