Target Audience

Advanced practice providers and physicians in critical care and emergency medicine

Learning Objectives

- Identify conduction disorders encountered in the critically ill patient post deep or moderate sedation.
- Discuss principles of primary and secondary brain injury.
- Identify systemic and site-specific clinical manifestations of life-threatening infections, including the use of clinical laboratory tests.
- Describe the timely assessment and classification of the burn patient.
- Define veno-venous (VV) and veno-arterial (VA) extracorporeal membrane oxygenation (ECMO).
- Describe the pathophysiology of the coagulation cascade.
- Describe pathologic changes to liver physiology with chronic liver disease.
- Discuss basic POCUS principles and indications.
- · Recognize clinically relevant sonographic findings of critically ill patients.
- Identify signs and symptoms of a patient with hemorrhagic shock in various critical care settings.
- Utilize case-based simulated scenarios to discuss clinical application of learned strategies.

POCUS Workshop
