Who Are We Looking For?

Racially underrepresented (UR) Associate or Full Professors to serve as facilitators for UR peer group mentoring sessions. Facilitators should have experience mentoring postdoctoral fellows or early career faculty and have a history of funding for biomedical research (the study of the biological/behavioral processes that advance the diagnosis, treatment and/or prevention of disease).

What Support Exists for Facilitators?

- Training (2-4 hours) in the use of a manual to guide discussions and activities.
- Ongoing support from the trainers as needed.
- A dedicated research coordinator to manage all logistics (e.g., scheduling, communications, materials).
- \$3,400 compensation (\$200/each 2 hour session)
- Professional satisfaction in contributing to this national effort and to the career development of UR early career researchers.
