What is **OPAT?**

Outpatient Parenteral Antibiotic Therapy (IV antibiotics at home)

What is the **OPAT Team?**

- Multidisciplinary team of ID pharmacists, nurses and doctors who systematically monitor a patient's progress and safety while receiving OPAT.
- The UNC OPAT team reviews/documents lab tests weekly and helps address antibiotic and infusion-related issues that arise during an outpatient IV antibiotic course.

Who is **eligible** for the **OPAT team**?

- 1. Patient admitted to Med K or seen by ID consult team
- 2. Planned to receive home IV antibiotics for ≥ 14 days
- 3. Not on hemodialysis or being discharged to an inpatient facility (SNF, LTAC, etc)
- 4. Does not have another provider (outside ID MD, transplant, oncology) who is able to follow labs

How to refer a patient to the OPAT team?

- 1. Send an email to OPAT@listserv.med.unc.edu
 - a. (email must be sent by ID consult team or Med K resident)
- 2. Include the following information:
 - -Patient name and MRN:

 - -Antibiotic name (and dose, if non-standard):
 - -Start date:
 - -End date and Total Duration:
 - -Is follow-up imaging needed?:
 - -One-liner (include info re: unusual management decisions):
- 3. Send at least one full business day before discharge
