

## **Mentor CV “Worksheet”**

The goal in reviewing your mentor’s CV and biosketch is to understand their career trajectory and consider the timing of major events in their career. We encourage you to get examples from 1-2 other faculty in addition to your mentor.

For the following questions, you don’t need to write answers, just think about them.

Things to consider when reviewing your mentor’s CV and biosketch:

1) Pay attention to career milestones:

- a. duration of training (fellowship, post-doc);
- b. time as instructor, assistant professor, and/or associate professor;
- c. timing of first grants, including as student and faculty member (if any);
- d. received K-award?;
- e. timing of first R01 or equivalent (if any);
- f. types of grants received?;
- g. balance of PI vs co-investigator;
- h. number of papers – per year, and trajectory;
- i. papers versus abstracts;
- j. timing/presence of editorial boards/editorships;
- k. journals that they review for (ask them how many reviews per year);
- l. teaching responsibilities;
- m. anything else?

**We suggest that you meet with your mentor to discuss this review and other items (see CareerPlan\_Introduction2024.docx) In that meeting, we’ll encourage you to ask them questions about their career path, review your personal goals, and lastly, address how they like to engage with you as a mentee.**
