**Depression & Suicide in Children and Adolescents****09/22/2010**

Over the past 35 years, suicide has more than tripled among adolescents, and risk has also increased among younger children. In this workshop, Jodi Flick will identify the most important risk factors for suicide in young people and describe the most effective interventions in prevention of suicide with at-risk children and their families. She will also discuss guidelines for intervention in the aftermath of a suicide. *Featured presenter: Jodi Flick, ACSW*

Parent-child visits are essential tools for achieving child safety, permanence, and well-being.
