She received her doctorate degree in anthropology from the University of Colorado at Boulder (CU Boulder, 1995); her master's degree in anthropology and bachelor's degree in psychology are from the University of Florida (UF, 1993 and 1990). She is also interested in forensic science issues related to theory, methodology, and practice.



Angie Alexander started as a new graduate nurse in the Emergency Department at Carolinas Medical Center, in Charlotte, 27 years ago. She has been a bedside nurse, assistant nurse manager and interim nurse manager. She has been the Forensic Program Coordinator for Carolinas Medical Center for 10 years managing a SANE team of 15 nurses who respond to 8 facilities in the Charlotte Metro area.
