The Clinical Research Coordinator (CRC) courses provide foundational and advanced role-based training for clinical research that expands beyond but is directly connected to the HSP and GCP courses. The CRC Foundations course is designed for new CRCs, while the CRC Advanced course is aimed at CRCs who have experience in human subjects research. Two CRC Advanced modules are highlighted below:

- **Project Management for Clinical Trials:** This module provides a succinct overview of project management principles, how the principles can be applied to managing clinical trials, and how using project management methodologies can increase trial efficiency by minimizing omissions and redundant activities. This module also discusses tools that CRCs can use to help manage a clinical trial.
- **Preventing and Identifying Misconduct and Noncompliance:** This module describes the CRC's role in preventing and identifying misconduct and noncompliance in clinical research, and provides strategies for investigating issues, performing a root cause analysis, and creating a Corrective and Preventative Action (CAPA) plan.
