I'll be spending one year of research sabbatical leave in 2017 and return as a Professor of Dermatology. The last 16 years have been challenging and rewarding and I have attempted to continue the tradition of excellence established by the former chairs of the Department: Dr. Richard Dobson, Dr. Clayton Wheeler, and Dr. Robert Briggaman. As I see it, the future of the Department is bright and the selected leader that will follow me will take our Department higher to even accomplishments.



my tenure as Chair, During the Department has expanded in all its missions, i.e., patient care, education, and research. We provide clinical services at four sites: Southern Village, Chapel Hill (headquarters), Raleigh (near Rex Hospital), Burlington, and the Office Hillsborough Medical Two of these sites Building/Hospital. were donated by former UNC alumni: Dr. Laurinda Queen in Raleigh (practice) and Dr. Richard Henderson in Burlington (practice and real estate). Further, we have been assigned an office which is occupied by our dermatologist/hospitalist - a new service covering the inpatient consultation service at UNC Hospitals Medical Center.

Sadly, our traditional flights to Fayetteville to care for Veterans using our UNC small planes were interrupted in 2013, as the VA

Medical Hospital hired a full-time dermatologist.

We started with a small number of faculty as shown on the 2000-2001 UNC Faculty

Directory. From this group we have three remaining: Dr. Thomas, Dr. Rubenstein and me. Dr. Wheeler, Dr. Briggaman, Dr. O'Keefe, Dr. Patterson, and Dr. Tomsick retired. Dr. Fine moved to Vanderbilt University and Dr. Guest moved to a private practice. We recruited new faculty that have remained or have left to new opportunities: Dr. Simon Warren, Dr. Pamela Groben, Dr. John Woosley, Dr. Heidi Jacobe, Dr. Lowell Goldsmith, Dr. David Grekin, Dr. Richard Scher, Dr. Daniel Parsons, Dr. Diem Wu, Dr. Nathaniel Wilkin, Dr. Emily Schwarz, Dr. David Dasher, Dr. Susan Runge, Dr. Brooke Jackson, Dr. Kate Roy and Dr. Daniel Zedek. Dr. Briggaman, Dr. O'Keefe and Dr. Goldsmith remain as Professors Emeritus. As shown on the current faculty roster on page 3, we have a new generation of outstanding faculty members.

During the last 16 years, several "Centers of Excellence" have developed in our Department: Dermatopathology (Dr. Googe), Mohs Surgery (Dr. Merritt and Dr. Varma), Pediatric Dermatology (Dr. Morrell, Dr. Burkhart, and Dr. McShane), Melanoma Clinic (Dr. Thomas and Dr. Mauro), Autoimmune skin diseases (Dr. Culton and Dr. Diaz), Contact Dermatitis (Dr. Lugo-Somolinos), Hidradenitis (Dr. Sayed), Alopecia (Dr. Fox), Woman


Genital Dermatology (Dr. Corley), Cutaneous Lymphoma (Dr. Bowers) and the Hospitalist/Consultation Service (Dr. Sun). The number of patients seen in these facilities has grown from 14,000 per year in 2000, when located at the Ambulatory Care Center (ACC) on campus to around 40,000 per year in 2016.

The number of specimens processed by the dermatopathology laboratory (forming part of our department since my arrival) have grown as well (see below). Similarly, the Mohs Surgery unit has exponentially grown under the leadership of Dr. Merritt and Dr. Varma. In 2014, we transitioned from the WEB-CIS electronic medical record to EPIC. This growth of our Department has enhanced the educational activities of our residents and medical students.

The UNC Dermatology alumni have continuously shown their gratitude to our Department by endowing three distinguished professor chairs: the Clayton E. Wheeler, Jr., before my arrival and the Irene & Robert "Al" Briggaman Professorship and the Louis Skinner Professorship during my tenure. In recent years, our alumni have continued to support our department with practice donations of Dr. Laurinda Queen (1983-1986) in Raleigh and Dr. Richard Henderson (1965-1968) in Burlington (http://tinyurl.com/j5ql9wn). This support has become instrumental in our continued growth and development. The Department of Dermatology will be eternally grateful to our alumni for their continuous support.

In the Research Mission we have continued to advance the areas of autoimmunity of blistering diseases and melanoma, both sponsored by NIH grants. We remained among the top 10 NIH ranked US departments of dermatology, although recently we dropped in 2015. This will be a challenging area in the future of the Department, since NIH funding is becoming scarce and more competitive.

To conclude I'm grateful to the institution and our hard working faculty and residents and our clinic and administrative personnel for their continuous support. This support has been instrumental in allowing me to reach incredible goals including serving as President of the Society of Investigative Dermatology (2000-2001) and the Association of Professors of Dermatology (2014-2016); elected member of the American Academy of Dermatology Board of Directors (2005) and becoming a member of the Institute of Medicine-National Academy of Medicine (2002).

Dean William Roper has appointed Dr. Nancy Thomas as Chair of the UNC Department of Dermatology effective January 1, 2017. I'm extremely pleased that one of our own faculty members, Dr. Thomas, will lead the Department. I have full confidence that Dr. Thomas will continue making our Department a bastion of excellence in education, patient care, and research.

As a professor of dermatology, I will continue supporting the academic missions of our department.



Recently Recruited Faculty

Dr. Adewole Adamson: Dr. Adamson joined our department on July 1, 2015 after finishing his dermatology resident training at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center. Dr. Adamson received an MD from Harvard Medical School within the Division of Health Science and Technology, a partnership with MIT. While in medical school he spent a year in NIAMS at the NIH, then subsequently received the Zuckerman Fellowship through the Center for Public Leadership at Harvard Kennedy School, where he obtained a Master in Public Policy. He has a clinical interest in the immunologic basis of skin disease particularly in skin of color. As a health services researcher, much of his research efforts are focused on health disparities, access to specialty health care, and health care costs.

Dr. Edith Bowers: Dr. Bowers joined our department's faculty on July 1, 2015 after finishing her dermatology resident training here at the University of North Carolina. Dr. Bowers received her MD, PhD from Duke University Medical School. While in graduate school, she studied an endogenous vehicle for receptor-mediated antigen delivery and how it could be utilized to enhance antigen-specific MHC Class I presentation and cytotoxic T-cell responses. Her clinical interest is in the diagnosis and management of cutaneous lymphomas. She also practices general adult dermatology, and enjoys teaching residents in procedural and laser clinics.


Dr. Sarah Corley: Dr. Corley joined our department on July 1, 2015 after completing her dermatology residency at the University of North Carolina (UNC), where she served as chief resident in her final year. Dr. Corley received her Master of Science degree in Anatomy and Neurobiology at the Medical College of Virginia/Virginia Commonwealth University (MCV/VCU) in Richmond, VA, where she investigated the effects of deafness on the reorganization of the brain. She subsequently obtained her Doctor of Medicine degree at the MCV/VCU School of Medicine where she was inducted into the Alpha Omega Alpha Honor Society. She has served as medical staff and camp counselor at the American Academy of Dermatology's Camp Discovery during both her medical and residency

training. Dr. Corley currently represents UNC Dermatology annually at the Southeastern Consortium for Dermatology as a steering committee member. She is actively involved in the teaching of our current residents and medical students at UNC-Chapel Hill with special interest in medical dermatology as well as dermatologic surgery.

Dr. Paul Googe: The UNC Department of Dermatology recruited Dr. Googe as Professor of Dermatology and Director of the Dermatopathology Laboratory. He joined us on October 17, 2016. He is dedicated to providing Dermatopathology expertise to the UNC Health Care System and other physicians in the community. As well, he will be training and educating dermatology and pathology residents and working with UNC researchers. Dr. Googe has held academic appointments at Vanderbilt University and the University of Tennessee College of Medicine as a Clinical Professor in the Departments of Pathology. He served as the Laboratory Director of Knoxville Dermatopathology from 1997-2015.

Dr. Natalie Sun: Dr. Sun joined the Tarheel family in the Department of Dermatology at UNC Chapel Hill as an Assistant Professor and the new face of their hospital consultation service on October 1, 2015. Prior to joining UNC, she completed a clinical fellowship at the University of California-San Francisco under the tutelage of Lindy Fox and Timothy Berger, her dermatology residency at Case Western Reserve University where she served as Chief Resident, and obtained her MD from the Duke University School of Medicine. Her clinical interests span complex medical dermatology and inpatient consultative dermatology. She has published on these topics and is a member of the Society of Dermatology Hospitalists, Medical Dermatology Society, and the American Academy of Dermatology.


