## TEACHING ACTIVITIES

## Lectures

- Pediatric Emergency Medicine Fellowship (2019, 2021, 2023): Provide interactive epidemiology overview lecture on a variety of topics relevant to fellows' board exams. Lecture includes mini journal club to identify key concepts of study design and potential bias in recent articles. Fellowship program has 3 trainee positions.
- Medical Student Training ISTEM / MSTAR / T35 (Summers 2019, 2020, 2021): Provided interactive lecture on creating data analysis plan and writing methods section for scholarly publication. The department trains 4-10 medical students each summer who have been awarded grants to complete summer research projects. This lecture provides structure on how to plan for and create any potential outputs for poster/manuscript that can also be used as a communication tool with their project Advisor and Biostatistician.
- DPOP870: Pharmaceutical Outcomes Research (Spring 2019): Guest lecturer to 5-7 students on topic of applying competing risks approaches to assessing patterns of healthcare service utilization after an index event. This is a graduate level course designed to provide training in intermediate-to-advanced-level applied and contemporary research methods in evaluating pharmaceutical treatment utilization and outcomes.
- MEDI 220: Clinical Epidemiology (Fall 2014, Fall 2015, Spring 2016): Served as co-instructor where I facilitated weekly lectures, group activities, and graded critical review paper for 30-35 medical students. Course is taught to first and second year medical students in preparation for certification board exam.
- EPID 690: Special Topics in Epidemiologic Research Using Healthcare Databases (Spring 2013): Assisted primary instructor by leading several lectures on connecting to the server and SAS SQL Introduction, assisting students with coding issues, grading homework assignments and attending weekly lectures. Course allowed 20-25 graduate students to use a large private insurance claims database to perform an epidemiologic project.
