Patient Criteria:

- 1. Has a diagnosis of CHF, COPD, Pneumonia, Wound/Cellulitis, or COVID 19 (More diagnosis to be added during optimization)
- 2. And Lives in Orange, Durham, Wake, or Chatham Counties.
- 3. <u>And</u> needs a nursing visit within 12-18 hours and a virtual visit with a provider within 36 hours. Can care for themselves or has some support in the home.

Services:

- ➤ 10 patients touch points in the first seven days including in home visits, virtual visits by RNs and providers.
- > RN visit within 12-18 hours of referral
- ➤ Virtual provider visit within 36 hours and again at 5-7 days. Ongoing oversight of plan of care from a Central Group of UNCPN Providers for up to 60 days of care.
- Central provider group access to specialty consultation.
- Coordination of care for imaging, follow up labs, therapeutic drug monitoring, skilled needs such as wound care and IV infusion.
- > PT. OT. ST. MSW. and HHA services
- IV infusion of attached medications and O2 concentrators and nebulizers in the ED with a 1 hour turnaround. For ED referrals we will take the patient home with PIV and coordinate PICC placement.

How to Order:

- 1. Put REF 34 in EPIC and completed AMB HME order. Call 984-974-6200 to let them know that you are referring the patient and the orders are in the system. (OR)
- 2. Simply call 984-974-6200 and provide verbal orders to our nurse liaisons and we will put the orders in and route them to you for signature. The liaison will notify the DME, Home Infusion, Home Health RN, and the CPG PCP of the incoming referral to ensure prompt scheduling. This call should take 3-5 minutes.

Closing the Loop:

- 1. The CPG PCP will contact the attributed PCP to let them know the patient has been enrolled in EHH due to an acute event.
- 2. The CPG PCP will contact the attributed PCP and the ED provider making the initial referral via in basket to close the loop after the 36 hour virtual visit is completed.
