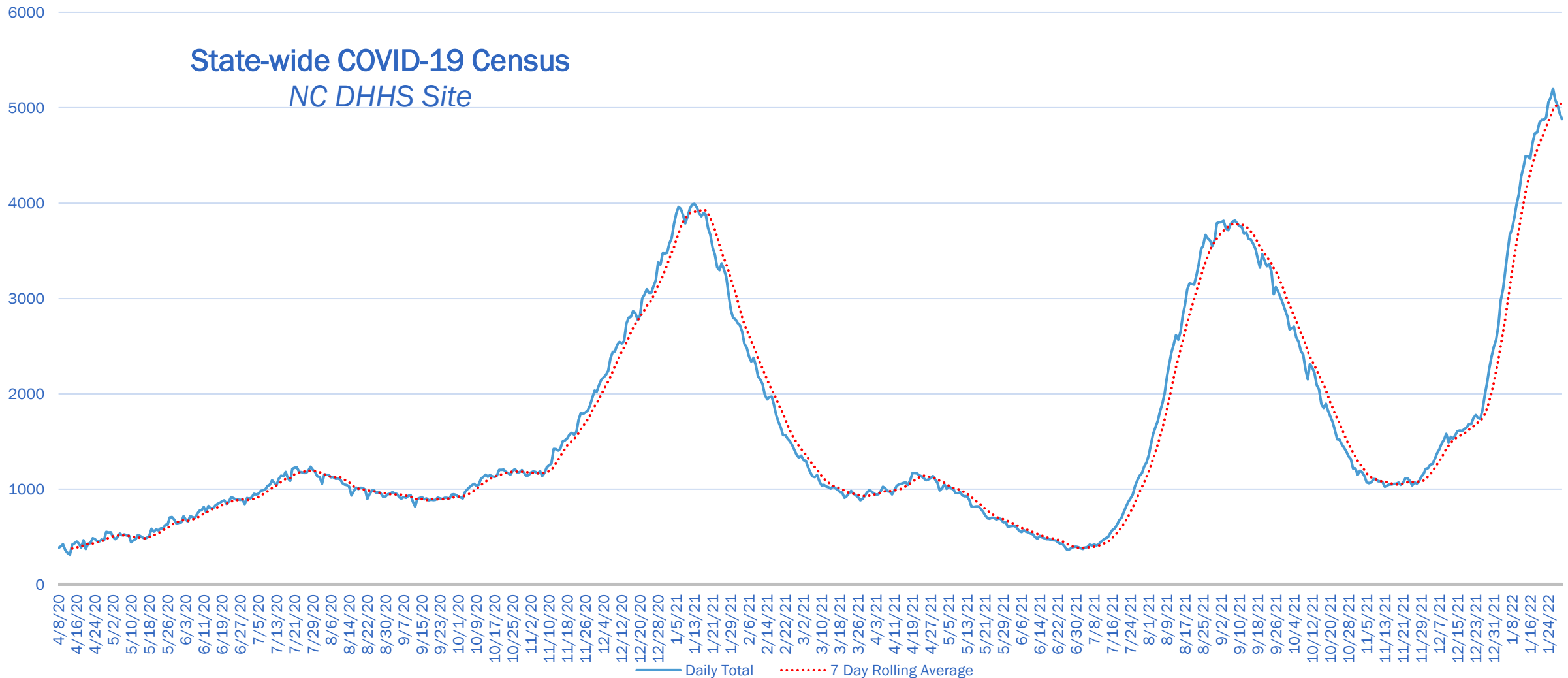

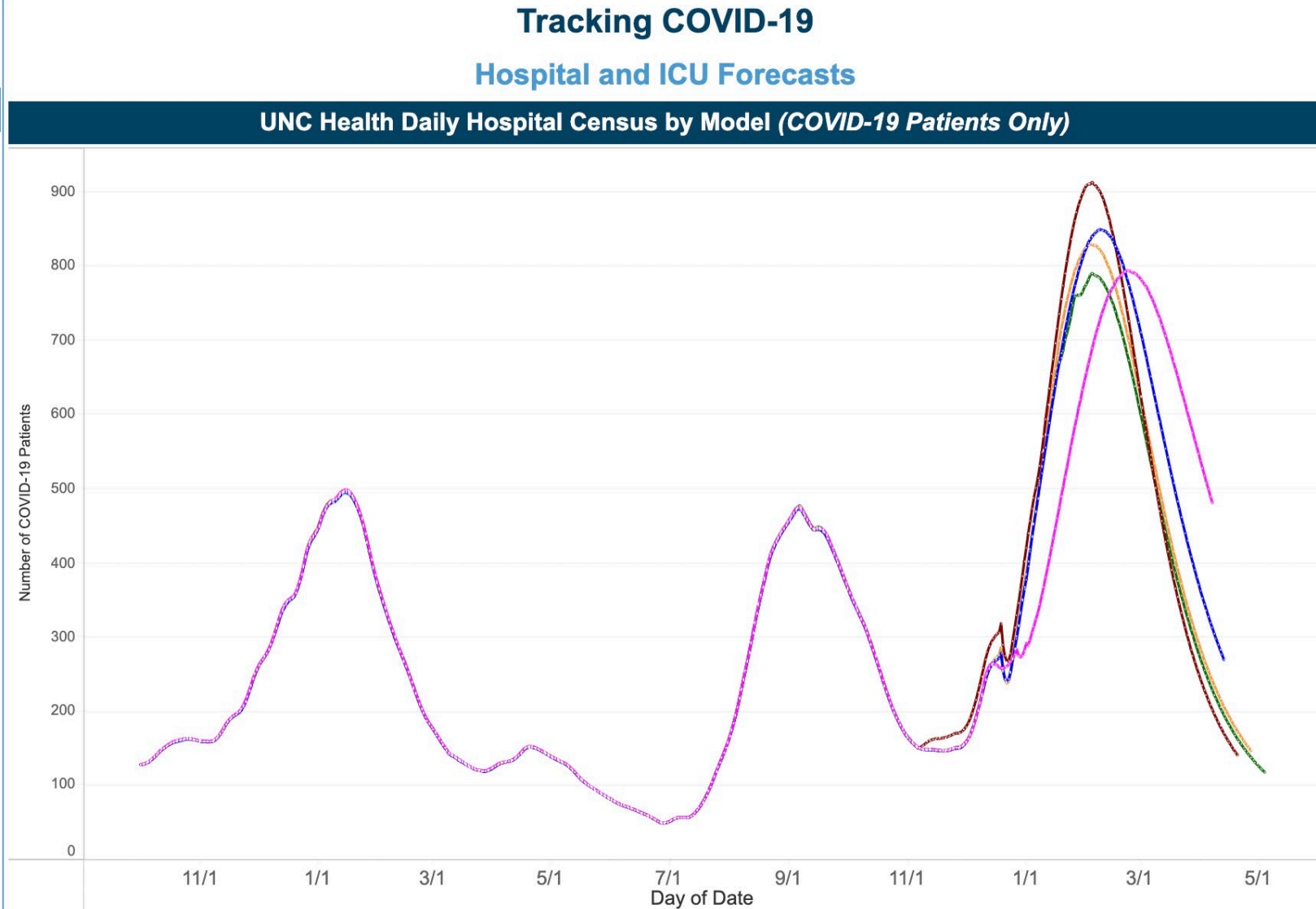

Covid-19 Guidance and Resources

- No changes to density restrictions in labs (for now)
- Continue to wear masks while in campus buildings (unless you can isolate in an office or conference room)
- Wear surgical, KN-95, N-95 masks (no cloth masks)
- Do not eat in groups (inside or outside). SOM Planning Office is installing outdoor heaters associated with restaurants
- Avoid large group meetings in person
- PPE and other supplies – department has surgical masks, Clorox wipes, hand sanitizer, gloves, water bottles. Let us know if you need anything
- Starting this week, UNC SOM will provide N-95 masks for all employees; stay tuned for availability details. Not mandatory but an additional mask option (surgical and double-surgical) – updates from Cara
- Everyone encouraged to order free covid test kits from federal government

Covid-19 Guidance and Resources

- Anyone testing positive should isolate at home for 5 days or until symptoms resolve. People that are potentially exposed should stay home if symptoms develop and get tested. While not mandatory, we ask that you inform your PI if you test positive (this will be kept confidential)
- Carolina Together testing program at Carolina Union now by appointment only through UNC HallPass app. Students can go to Campus Health for testing. Faculty and staff are recommended to use their health care provider, pharmacy, drive-thru testing sites, etc.

- Impact on research – make back-up plans, anticipating people will be isolating

2022 Department Annual DEI Training

- Mandatory training for all faculty (similar to last year Bias 101)
- ***Understanding and Navigating Microaggressions***
 - 1 hour (March 2 at noon)
 - Training will explore the concept of microaggressions.
 - Will explain important terminology related to microaggressions and will discuss some of the reasons that microaggressions can be challenging to identify and address.
 - Will give participants the opportunity to work in small groups to analyze specific examples of microaggressions that occur commonly in different SOM work and learning environments and to talk about how these might be handled in the future.
 - The training will require active participation, so please be present and prepared to engage with the content.
 - We encourage interested staff, trainees, or students to participate.

Educational Pathways to Increase Diversity in Genomics

- UNC EDGE was developed by the [Program for Precision Medicine in Health Care \(PPMH\)](#) and is led by Genetics faculty members Drs. Folami Ideraabdullah and Jonathan Berg.
- Two-year summer program combines career education, mentoring, and research skills training to support students from underrepresented and disadvantaged backgrounds that are interested in careers in genomics.
- UNC EDGE welcomes applications from college freshman and sophomore students who are underrepresented in the field of genomics. This includes Native Americans/Alaska natives, Hispanic Americans, Hawaiian natives/US Pacific Islanders and African Americans as well individuals with disabilities or from economically disadvantaged backgrounds.
