




What is a Stroke?



A stroke is a “**brain attack**” that occurs when **blood flow** to the brain is **cut off**.



There are **two types** of strokes:




Hemorrhagic




Occlusive


A hemorrhagic stroke:



When a vessel in the brain **ruptures** and **leaks** blood



Can affect a **large** or, **small** portion of the brain




Can affect **right, left, front or back** of brain

An **occlusive** (ischemic) stroke:




When a blood vessel to the brain is **blocked**.




When a blood clot from somewhere in the body travels to the brain

OR




When a blockage is formed inside one of the brain's arteries
