Prerequisite courses should have been completed with grades "C" or better. **AP/IB/CLEP credits, PASS/FAIL, or survey level courses (i.e. Survey of Organic Chemistry) cannot be used to fulfill prerequisite requirements.** Additionally, work experience may not be used as a substitute for prerequisite course requirements.

WHAT MAKES YOU UNIQUE FROM OTHER APPLICANTS?

Healthcare Experience: Needs to be 1,000 hours of direct, hands-on patient care.

- Volunteer or work: hospitals, clinics, nursing homes, assisted living centers, crisis nursery, rehab centers are a few examples
- Certified Nurses' Aide/EMT
- Military medic/Corpsman, Surgical Technician, Ophthalmic Technician, Phlebotomist, Athletic Trainer, Physical Therapy Aide, etc.
- Still not sure? Ask yourself these questions:
Did I assess a patient for their current condition?
Did I provide a form of treatment for a patient?
Did I place my hands on the patient to perform or assist in performing a task?

Personal Statement

- Make it interesting
- Include new information that is not found elsewhere in your application
- Once you finish PA school, what are your plans?
- Why should we invest in you?

Letters of Recommendation: Three (3) letters are required.

- Letters should be written by people you have worked with closely who can attest to your character and patient care skills
- Two are required from a healthcare professional, preferably one of these should be from a PA
