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Why This Matters

• LGBTQ adolescents experience a number of mental and physical health disparities.

> Depression, anxiety, suicide, substance abuse, obesity, eating disorders

• Nearly half of transgender individuals attempt suicide

≻Childhood onset. Multifactorial.

- Stigma and rejection
- Avoidance of health care
- Welcoming pediatric care may:
 - Support LGBTQ teens to reduce health risks
 - Decrease future hesitancy to access care



Aims

• Create a welcoming environment:

Increase staff and provider knowledge and skills by 50% from baseline
 Visual cues of inclusivity in 100% of patient rooms and on 30% of individuals
 Ask about sexual orientation and gender identity (SO/GI) at 90% of acute visits

• Support LGBTQ patients

□Screen for psychosocial stressors for 100% of LGBTQ patients






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Changing Clinic Culture





Proportion of Teen Acute Visits with SO/GI Documented




Acute Visits with SOGI Documented



24 LGBTQ patients:

- 6: no routine care in past 2 years
- 8: recent well care, but SO/GI status not or incorrectly documented
- 13: depression, anxiety, and/or suicidal ideation


