# Piedmont Health Services (PHS)

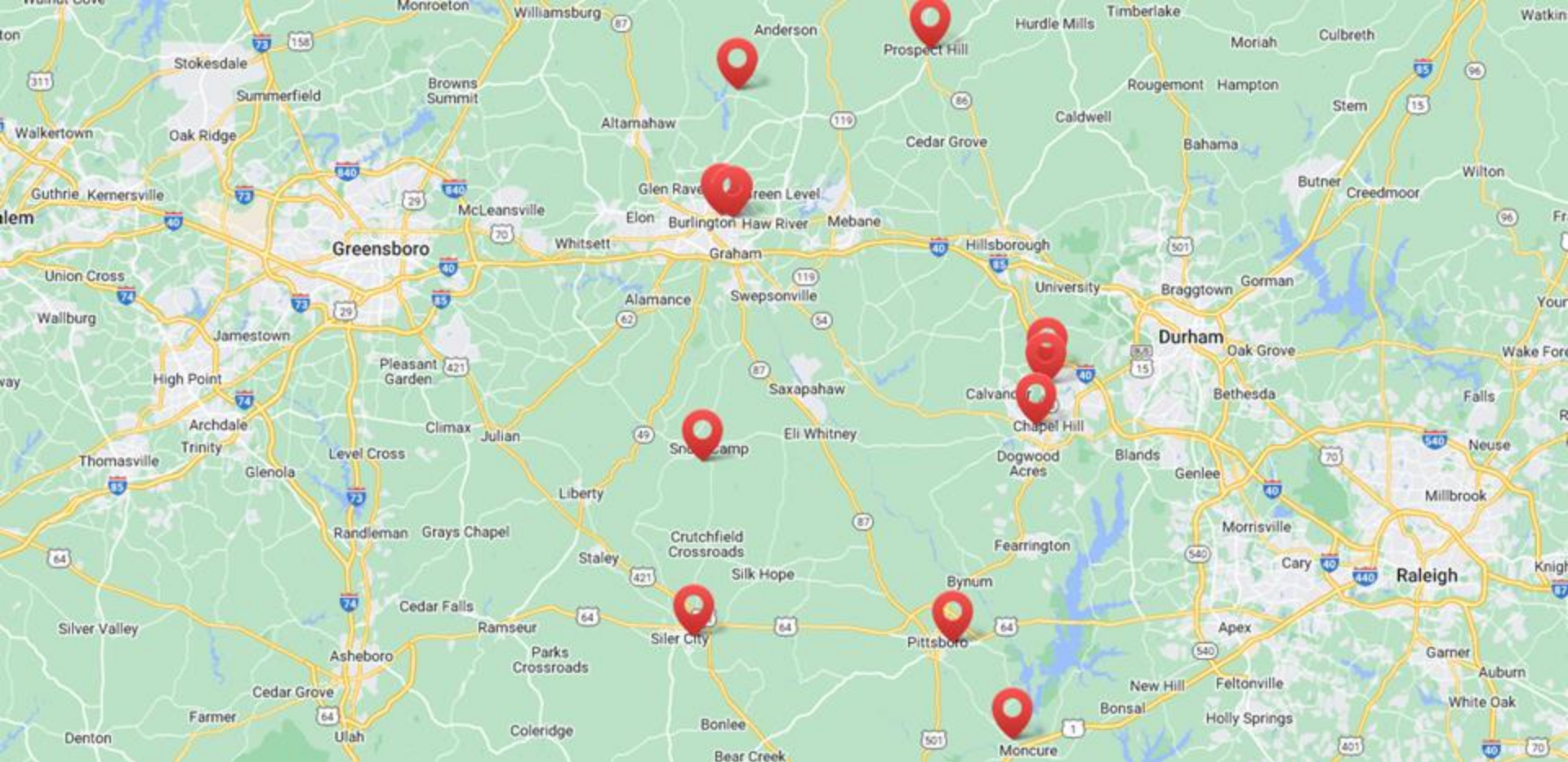


## **Mission:**

**To improve the health and well-being of the community by providing high-quality, affordable, and comprehensive primary health care.**

- **Piedmont Health Services is a non-profit, Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) Community Health Center. This means PHS is recognized by the federal government as a institution that brings care to underserved populations, and receives federal grants.**
- **PHS services include primary care, dental, in-house pharmacies, senior care (through PACE), and Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) care.**
- **Community health centers aim to increase access to healthcare in their community, usually for underserved communities.**
- **One reason community health centers are needed is that people living in rural areas often are sicker and have less access to healthcare**

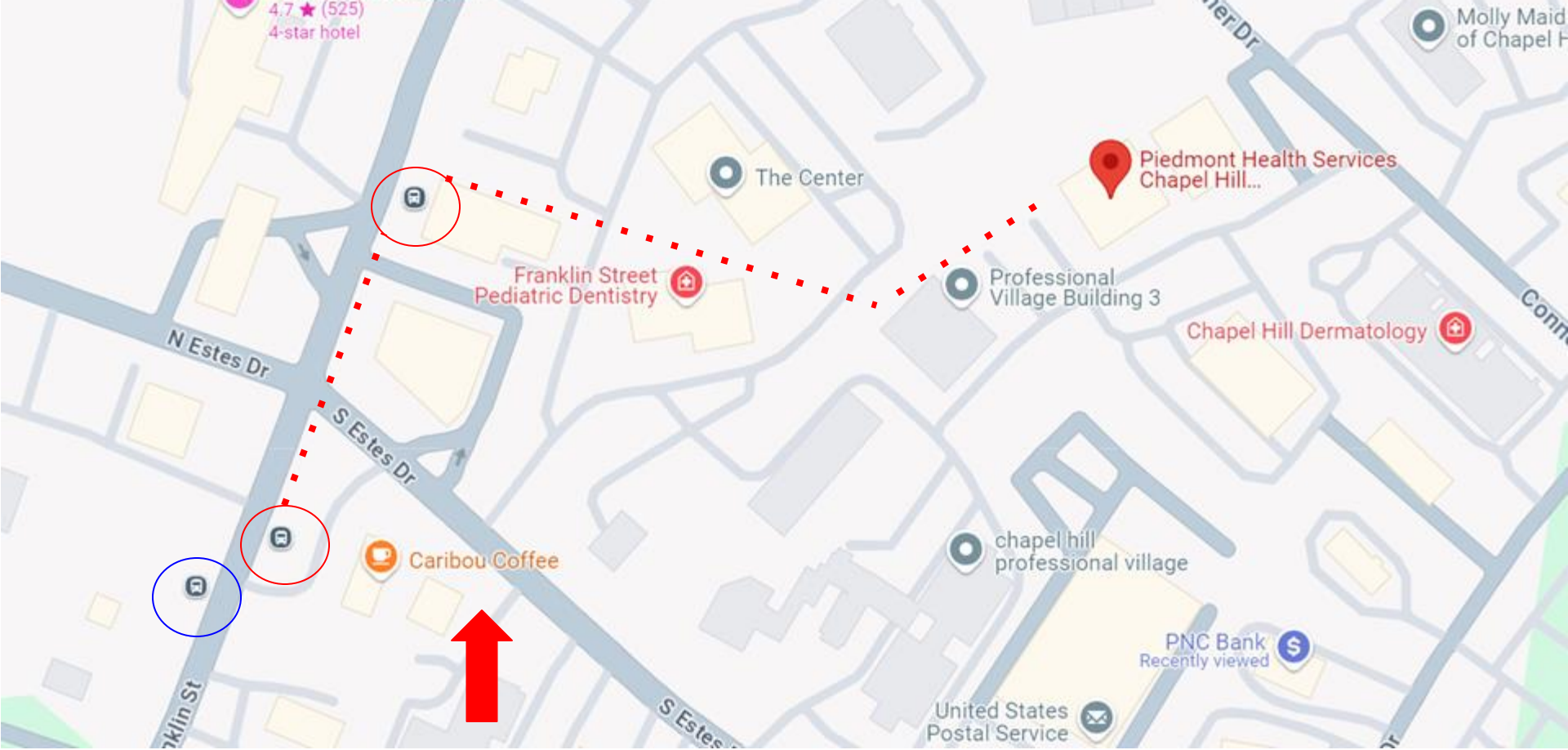
**Patients can use the bus to get to the clinic, acquire groceries, and medication.**

- Pharmacy is built into the clinic
  - Walgreens = 0.2 miles away
- If patients need hospitalization, UNC Hospitals is only 4 miles away

# Our Experience at PHS – Chapel Hill

## Demographics

- Low-income; may live in rural areas
- Newly acquainted with the U.S.
- Gender diverse
- Prenatal, pediatric, and geriatric populations

## Insurance Barriers

- Self-pay
- Medicaid, Medicare
- Financial aid was common (ex: Shingrex, UNC Financial Aid Application)

## Language Barriers

- Many patients primarily speak Spanish at this location
  - Instead of being a barrier, it is one of the clinic's strengths
- The majority of providers and medical assistants are fluent in Spanish
  - Translation tablets also available for access live, paid translators for a plethora of languages



## Staffing

- Adequately staffed, but sometimes understaffed
- Less compensation when working in community health clinics
- However, staff are passionate about their roles

# Learning Observations



Alix:

Connecting patients to resources is a priority of healthcare providers. Filling out financial assistance forms, for example, shows how the goal is not only about giving out medications, but providing patients with what is best for *them*.

Eli:

One thing I learned this summer was how integral medical assistants are to clinics. They do paperwork, clean, check in patients, give vaccines, organize, and if they are off, the whole clinic is off. Having excellent medical assistants is a must for a clinic to be successful.

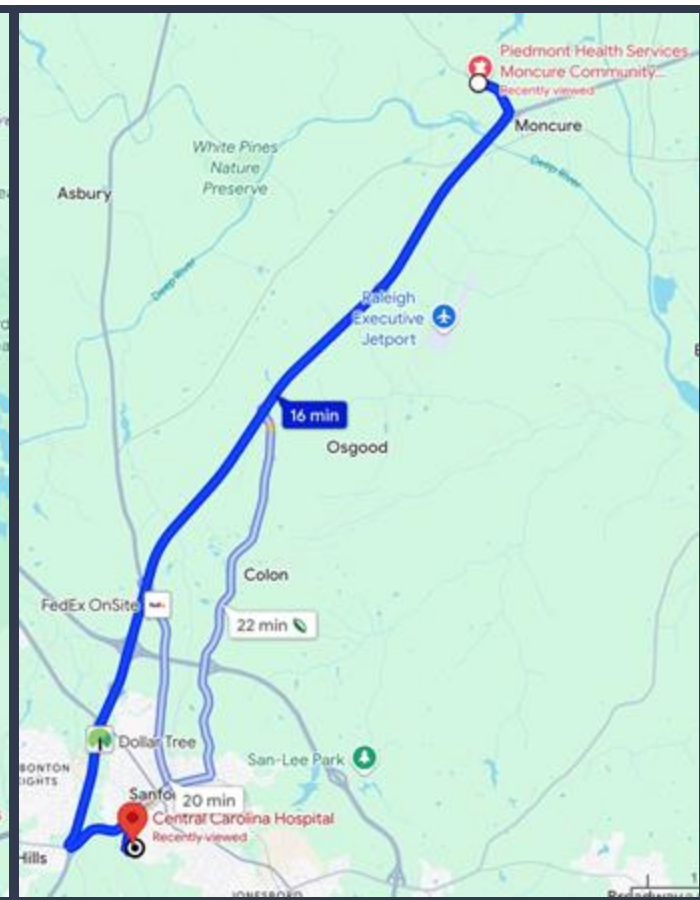
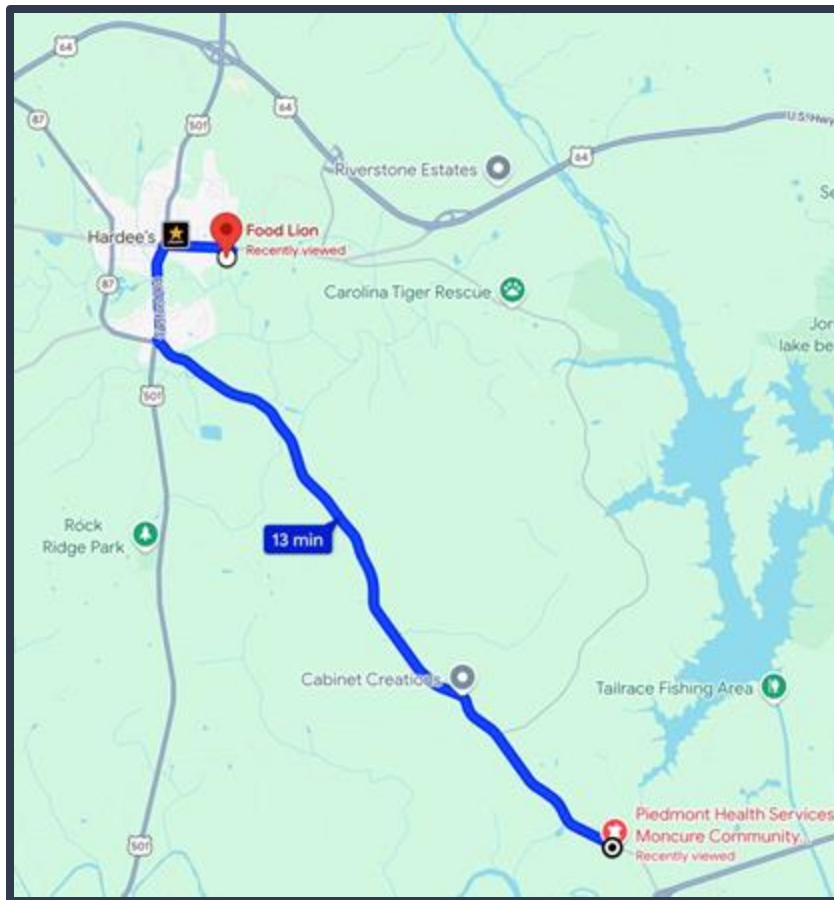

Jadyn: Being able to interact with every person who made the clinic able to run was important to me in understanding the impactful role each person must play in order to have a functional clinic that provides exceptional care

Jaques: Building relationships and connecting with patients was something I found really important during my time in the clinic. Even though I was meeting each patient for the first time, being the friendly face that helped them feel comfortable was truly a pleasure.



- **Demographics:** Mainly Hispanic patient population; patients range from infants to elderly with supporting services in Pediatrics, Women health, Dentistry, Primary Care, etc.
- **Insurance Barriers:** Medicare/ medicaid, Self-pay, or through financial aid programs (care management team)
- **Language barriers:** Majority of patients solely spanish speaking but almost every provider and receptionist spoke spanish, as well as some MA's and other staff. Online translators via tablet or were available if/when necessary
- **Staffing:** each member of the staff is required to work one saturday a month; some staff float to and from different PHS locations, as well as travelling from different areas (i.e. PA who is a professor at Campbell, Research staff who work at corporate, etc.)

## Nearest Stops

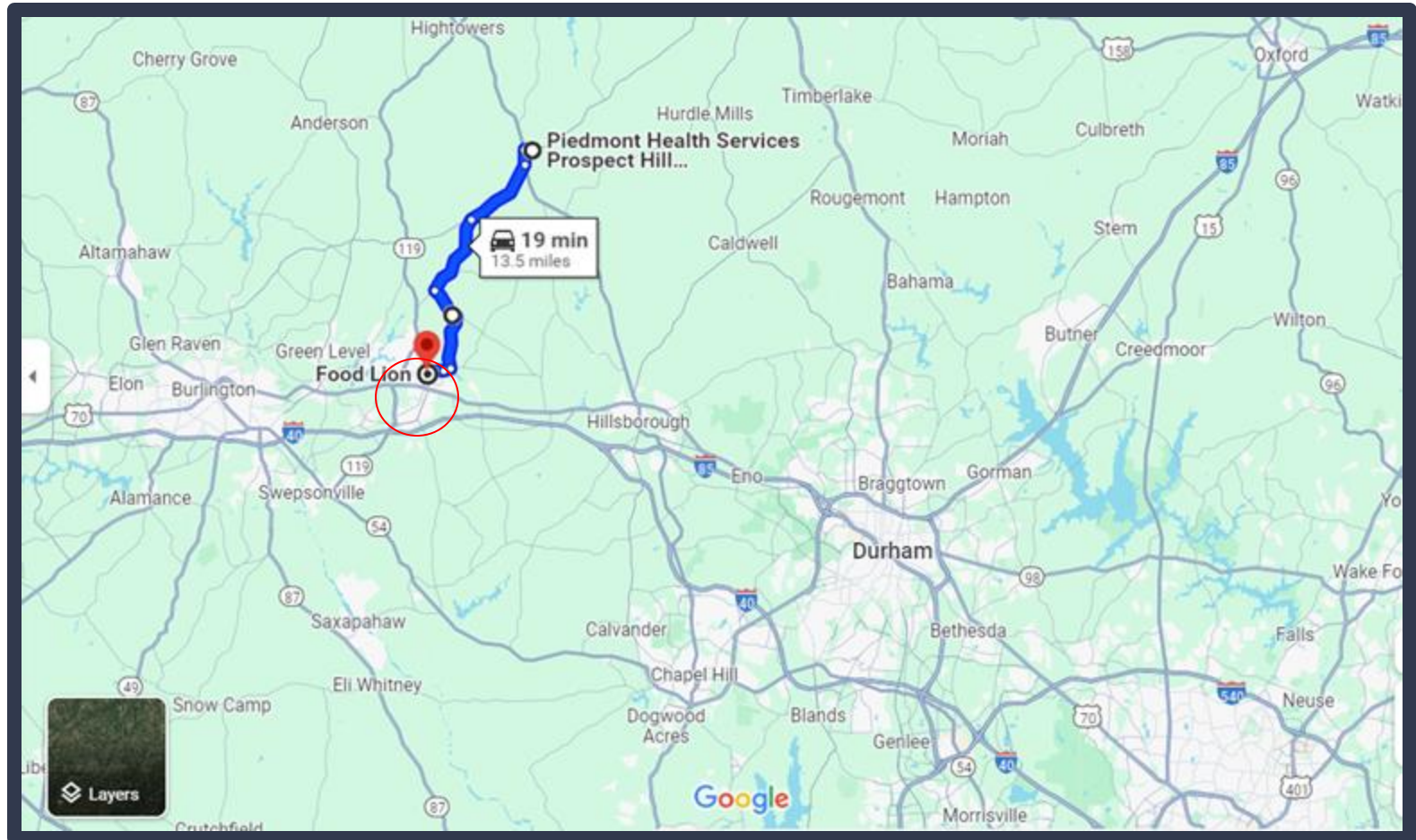
- **Bus: (6.6mi) ~9 minutes**

# Learning Observations

- What resonated with me throughout my summer experience was how each provider knew a degree of Spanish and was able to communicate fluently with their patients with minimal assistance.
- The jobs of the MA's also resonated with me, as they primarily take up the job of a typical nurse in a doctor's office.

**Demographics:** Majority Hispanic patient population. Patients of all ages, from infants to elderly adults, are seen at the Prospect Hill Center.

**Insurance barriers:** For those unable to get Medicaid, is the UNC Financial Assistance Program. Provides financial assistance for NC residents with federal income below 250% of the federal poverty line.

**Language barriers:** Some patients only spoke Spanish. Most of those I came into contact with spoke both Spanish and English.
