## GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

The Adult Sepsis Bundle order set has been updated to include more options for fluid resuscitation. Click on the IV fluid bolus orders to open the fluid resuscitation options. Providers can more easily order lactated ringers as well as fluid resuscitation by ideal body weight. It is important to note that the 1000mL normal saline bolus is no longer defaulted, so providers must select from the fluid resuscitation options. We hope that these changes make it easier for providers to make the right fluid choices for their patients. See the attached PDF for more details.
