

Resident Expectations

When arriving at 7 AM, each resident may be assigned to 5-7 patients per day.

Residents are assigned patients in this order:

- 1) Patients you, or colleagues from your department, admitted within the past 24 hours
- 2) Patients you had seen the previous day or are familiar with
- 3) Patients located between room 1208 through 1225

Once your patients have been seen and staffed with the Observation attending, and a disposition plan has been established (and depending upon the complexity of your patients), you may be assigned to 1-2 new admissions per afternoon, between 1 PM and 5 PM.

When arriving at 12 PM, each resident should be responsible for focusing on admissions. Depending on how busy each day may be, your goal will be to complete a full admission (H&P, orders, sign out documentation) and staff that patient with the Observation attending prior to seeing another patient for admission.

Note Templates – all Observation Note templates can be found in Christopher Caulfield's smartphrases and start with *.OBS*

Admission Order Set Template – utilize the *OBS UNIT BASIC ORDERS* order set, which can be found searching for the specific user order set under the user Christopher Caulfield

Internal medicine residents need to sign in to pager 123-8818 at the beginning of each shift, make sure you sign yourself out of the pager at the end of shift

Family medicine residents need to sign in to pager 123-8819 at the beginning of each shift, make sure you sign yourself out of the pager at the end of shift

Make sure you sign yourself out from the pager before you leave.
