

ANNOUNCING A NEW UNC HEALTH CARE CLINIC FOR REPRODUCTIVE WOMEN WITH KIDNEY DISEASE

Beginning October 2019, Dr. Christina Herrera of the Division of Maternal-Fetal Medicine and Dr. Monica Reynolds of the Division of Nephrology and Hypertension at UNC's School of Medicine will open a joint nephrology / maternal-fetal medicine clinic to provide evidence-based, patient-centered, multidisciplinary care to reproductive women with chronic kidney disease (CKD) who are currently pregnant or considering pregnancy.

Referral indicators include (but are not limited to):

- Chronic kidney disease, stages 2-5
- End-stage renal disease
- Interstitial renal disease
- Renovascular hypertension
- Type 1 or 2 diabetes mellitus with diabetic nephropathy
- Kidney transplant
- Polycystic kidney disease
- IgA nephropathy
- Persistent proteinuria or hematuria
- First-trimester gestational edema with proteinuria
- Lupus nephritis
