

Dr. Urrutia is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. She is a board-certified obstetrician-gynecologist, preventive medicine specialist, and women's reproductive epidemiologist, and is a practicing clinician and researcher. She is co-clinical founder of Reply Ob/Gyn & Fertility, a new fertility awareness Ob/Gyn clinic opening in Cary (Panther Creek?), NC, in July 2015. The Reply clinic will employ a novel approach to reproductive medicine and will provide inpatient care at UNC Health System.

Dr. Urrutia's research focuses on developing behavior change programs that will help reproductive-age women improve their long-term health and wellbeing. Other research interests include fertility awareness, health disparities, and patient-centered program development and evaluation. She is a principal investigator for a new cohort study in development, the Bio-marker Based Study of Fertility and Health Outcomes ("Biofertility Study").

Dr. Urrutia is originally from New England where she attended Clark University and Harvard Medical School. She completed her residency in obstetrics and gynecology at Duke University, her epidemiology degree at UNC, and her preventive medicine residency at UNC.

Dr Urrutia is married to Gene, a biostatistician and they have two small sons. They raise their boys in Durham county on a small farm which currently includes chickens and a garden.
