The **University of North Carolina Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology** is seeking candidates for the Women's Reproductive Health Fellowship ([General Obstetrics and Gynecology Reproductive Health Fellowship - UNC Department of Obstetrics & Gynecology](#)). The department is committed to developing the next generation of well-trained clinician researchers to achieve equity in health and health care for women across the lifespan. To achieve this goal, the Division of Obstetrics and Gynecology, in collaboration with the UNC Gillings School of Global Public Health, offers a 2-year clinical-research fellowship with the aim to increase the number of academic specialists who pursue successful faculty careers, engaging in clinical care, research and teaching. As part of the program, fellows obtain formal didactic training in the School of Public Health, expert mentoring and develop a research plan focusing on their clinical and public health interests.

Fellows have the option to receive research training through a **Master of Science in Clinical Research (MSCR)** in the Department of Epidemiology in the School of Public Health. **All fellows actively engage in clinical activities, including outpatient**

care, labor and delivery, in-hospital gynecology attending and gynecologic surgery. In addition to clinical and research experience, fellows develop strong leadership skills, enhance their communications abilities and learn to lead clinical and research teams. Fellows dedicate 50% time to clinical activities and 50% time to research/research training. The fellowship program is housed within the Division of General Ob/Gyn and led by Wanda Nicholson, MD MPH MBA (Fellowship Director) and Kavita Arora (Division Director).
