What is Palliative Care?

Palliative Care is medical care that helps improve quality of life for patients and their families. Our focus is managing symptoms that may occur during or after cancer treatment to make patients feel better.

Palliative care providers also help patients talk about values, goals, and medical decisions with their family and cancer care team.

Palliative Care may be requested the first time a patient learns that he/she has cancer. Our services are best integrated with all types of cancer treatment. We also provide care after the completion of cancer-directed treatments, with transition to survivorship services.

Will my Insurance Cover Palliative Care?

Most insurance plans, including Medicare and Medicaid, cover palliative care.

What Services are Offered?

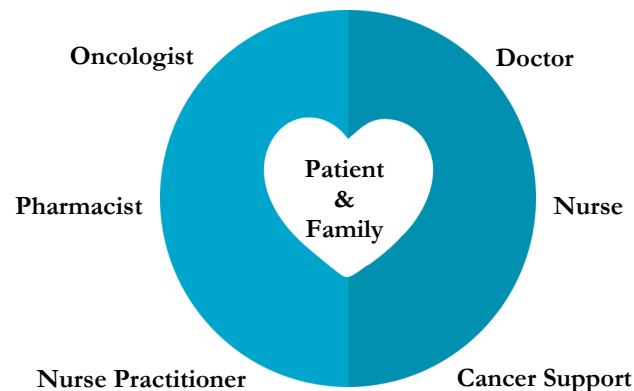
The Palliative CARE team will help you:

C: Communicate your values, goals, and treatment preferences with your family and cancer care team members. This will guide you with advance care planning and cancer care decision making.

A: Address and manage symptoms from cancer and treatment side effects such as pain, fatigue, nausea, weight loss, or trouble sleeping.

R: Recognize, address, and cope with psychosocial distress that may include anxiety, depression, fears and spiritual concerns.

E: Emphasize YOU and your family as the central part of your healthcare.



Who is the Palliative Care Team?

The UNC Outpatient Oncology Palliative Care team has doctors, a nurse practitioner, pharmacist, nurse, and support staff. Our team partners with your cancer care team to treat and manage your symptoms.

The Palliative Care team works closely with dietitians, chaplains, and social workers to create a care plan in partnership with your oncologist. We use this plan to treat your symptoms, improve communication, and make your quality of life better.

The UNC Outpatient Oncology Palliative Care team is available to all adult patients across our outpatient oncology clinics. This includes medical and hematologic oncology, surgery, radiation oncology, and gynecology. Ask your cancer care team for a referral.
