About us

The North Carolina Child Medical Evaluation Program (CMEP) is a state-funded resource for NC child welfare agencies and is based out of the UNC School of Medicine. We roster qualified clinicians throughout the state to provide services helping to identify, treat and prevent child maltreatment.

What is CAPP?

The CAPP is an evaluation - driven by empirically supported measures - to understand a parent's ability and willingness to mitigate safety risks for their child. It is CMEP's newest clinical offering and is performed at the request of child welfare by mental health professionals throughout the state.
