Today's keynote lecture is given to commemorate Dr. Patricia C. Gregory, who served as a Simmons Scholar and Assistant Professor in the UNC-CH Department of Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation from 2005 until her untimely passing in 2010. Throughout those years, she developed a love and passion for research in health disparities, particularly in the areas of stroke prevention and rehabilitation, and geriatric rehabilitation. She was awarded prestigious grants from The Duke Endowment and the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ).



Dr. Gregory published many research articles in national and international journals, was known as an outstanding clinician, consistently acknowledged on the state and national lists of Best Doctors, and shared her expertise both locally and globally.
