#### Course Description

The incidence of melanoma continues to rise rapidly in this country. Increasingly, the management of the melanoma patient requires multiple healthcare providers. This course is specifically designed for a multidisciplinary view of the care of the melanoma patient. The course faculty will examine common clinical issues which often confront the clinician and provide information that will help in their clinical decision

#### Program Objectives

The information presented at this educational activity should improve your ability to diagnose and treat melanoma and aggressive non-melanoma skin cancers, focusing on the following issues:

- the clinical dilemmas facing both dermatologists and dermatopathologists in correctly diagnosing difficult melanocytic lesions including non-traditional anatomic locations
- the surgical issues facing the dermatologist and surgeon treating melanoma and aggressive cutaneous malignancies
- the tanning bed controversy as viewed by an Australian epidemiologist
- the current role of systemic therapy in the melanoma patient with metastatic disease, including updated information on CTLA-4 inhibitors. BRAF-inhibitors and MEK inhibitors
