3rd Annual TARC Research Day

Approximately 100 researchers, clinicians, research staff and trainees joined forces remotely this year to discuss how their latest scientific findings can yield innovative advances in arthritis, allergy, and autoimmune diseases. There were a total of approximately 30 presentations.

Keynote speaker, Dr. Jane Salmon, the Collette Kean Research Chair at the Hospital For Special Surgery, shared new findings in her presentation: "Can We Predict and Prevent Pregnancy Complications in Patients with Lupus Antiphospholipid Syndrome?"
