WHAT THEY ARE: abnormalities of the vasculature: capillaries, arteries, veins, lymphatic vessels or a combination of these.

RARE DISORDERS: There are fewer than 50,000 affected individuals across the US with some of these disorders compared to more than 5 million children and adults with ahistory of cancer.

SYMPTOMS: Many patients experience pain, swelling, difficulties with acts of daily living, and emotional distress from physical disfigurement.

OTHER ISSUES: Vascular anomalies can be single or multiple, visible or deep in the body. They may be associated with multiple problems (syndromes) such as limb overgrowth or skindiscoloration. They can also predispose patients to cancers.
