- Elective proposal approved
- Student updates - students submitted ERAS, mock interviews and preparing for interviews
- Dr Whitlock from Asheville Campus - Fall Educational Conference
 - Preceptor development and clinical teaching topics
 - Preceptors from all different clinical environments
 - Discussed cases, large group discussion and rich engagement
 - Talking about implicit bias and cognitive bias (anchoring, confirmation, framing, representative heuristic) and cases
 - Opportunities for collaboration across campuses
 - Educators and residents were in the audience

 - CPX = Clinical Performance Exam
 - A simulated clinical encounter assessment for all individualization phase students in preparation for step 2 CS
 - Goal is to start incorporate it into the new ACS course
 - Preparing students for residency
 - 6 standardized clinical encounters put together by Jeff McQueen
 - Will put together an individualized learning plan for encounters
 - Currently in the planning
 - Thinking about simulation incorporation eventually to help prepare students for residency
 - This will be the first iteration of this course
 - Likely grading will be pass/fail
- Dr. Winston Li Transition to Residency Course (TTR)
 - Feb 28th - March 25th, M-F 8am - 5pm
 - In person and virtual components
 - 3 weeks core curriculum, one week specialty specific
 - Four weeks total
 - Course for all individualization phase students to prepare for intern year
 - Will send out dates and expectations in an email to fourth years
